<p>This qualification is suitable for learners aged 19 or above who are working or interested in working in the early years sector. No previous experience of working in an early years setting is required.</p> <p>You must have attended an Information session before enrolment. Please note whilst the course is free, there is a £50 withdrawal or non-completion fee if you chose to withdraw from the course.</p>	

What will I learn on this course?
<p>This aim of this qualification is to provide an introduction to the early development of the brain in babies and young children from birth to 7 years of age. It looks at how the social brain develops, the limbic system and self-regulation. There are two units:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Understanding neuroscience in early years • Understanding self-regulation and how to nurture this in children from birth to seven years.

<p>This course is delivered via distance learning.</p> <p>You will have access to a dedicated Google classroom where you will access course materials to support your studies.</p> <p>There are two units each with assignments to complete. This will be submitted through Google Classroom.</p> <p>Please note that you will need access to a computer, iPad, or tablet to complete your tasks and have access to the internet. You will not be able to complete the course on a mobile phone.</p>	



Course Length

12 weeks, although you can complete more quickly if you wish.

Attendance

You must have attended the Information session where you will be shown the Classroom and resources.

This qualification doesn't lead to a specific job role but it provides continued professional development of new knowledge and skills and supports the Practitioner role in the workplace.
